1 Tokyo Station

The Tokyo Station brick station building was restored to its original appearance in October of 2012, taking pains to preserve the original historical building as much possible. During the Meiji Era a number of brick buildings were constructed modeled after Lombard Street in London. As the entryway to Tokyo, Tokyo Station is becoming an area of refined and sophisticated facilities and establishments including restaurants, shops, and more.

Hachiko's story was retold in the film Hachi: A Dog's Tale starring Richard Gere. The area is also known as the home of SHIBUYA109, a sacred place in young women's fashion. The postmodern cylindrical tower of the store is a symbol of Shibuya.

The Kaminarimon gate is a famous Asakusa landmark known as the temple gate to Sensōji Temple. The gate is easily identified by the 33 m wide, 39 m tall, 700 kg in weight large red lantern. The spot is popular with international tourists and approximately 30 million people visit each year. The Nakamise shopping center, which has been in continual existence since the Edo Period is popular spot nearby Sensoji Temple.

The 108 Sengedatsumon gates from the main gate represent the process of being freed from the 108 earthly desires. Sengedatsumon is registered as a national cultural asset.

Some points of interest near Takaozan Station include Monkey Park featuring over 60 monkeys, and Wildflower Garden, where you can see nearly 300 different types of wildflowers throughout the different seasons.

This area in downtown Tokyo full of kindness and warmth is where "Tora-san", the main character from the "Otoko no Tora-san" (It's tough being a man) series, became famous on a nationwide scale. This area is also known as the temple town to Daikyoji Temple, also known as Shibamata Taishakuten Temple, founded in 1629. Taishakuten is the merciful Buddhist ruler of gods. It is also said that he monitors the behavior of man and their committal of errors. If you visit Shibamata, make sure to pray to Taishakuten before enjoying the area's famous Kusa Dango and eel dishes.

This Kamakura Great Buddha is 13.35 meters in height including the pedestal. We know that construction started in 1252, but the date of completion, however, is unknown. This Great Buddha was apparently destroyed by typhoons and earthquakes. As one of the three Great Buddha statues in Japan, this Great Buddha seems to have different facial expressions depending on changes in the natural surroundings. Other nearby destinations include Hase-dera Temple and Ugafuku Shrine. Why not take a trip to Hase-dera Temple and give Shakyo (tracing the sutras) a try?

36 Nagareyama City

The old town of Nagareyama Honcho still remains and is the birthplace of white misirin cooking sauce. Historic buildings such as storehouses from the Meiji period have been reincarnated as the Kaleidoscope Gallery, cafes, restaurants, and other interesting places. The town also features many other tourist attractions including the Issa Soju Memorial Hall, an area where the famous Haiku poet Issa Kobayashi once stayed, as well as the ruins of the camp of Isami Kondo, the commander of the Shinsengumi samurai.
